General Instructions for use of loo

This Ladies and gentlemen is an eco friendly dry separating waterless composting loo, which if used properly will produce no odours and give no cause for concern...


Ladies, hovering over the loo seat is not an option, use an anti-bac wipe if you are concerned and place in bin provided. The loo seat must be sat upon to activate the trigger mechanism, which opens the sightscreen, to allow the safe passage of solids and loo roll. Urine (as you are designed) will automatically go to the front and anything else you care to produce will go into the container at the back. Loo roll is placed into the back of the loo by depressing the seat with hand or knee

Gentlemen, if you prefer to stand when urinating, please use the urinal provided. For those of you who are used to urinating into a toilet bowl, please, please sit to do so. No liquids must enter the back compartment, which is situated under the blue sightscreen, (have a look by all means but please do not press the flap). Depress the seat and the sightscreen will move to the side.

This remarkable toilet works with the co-operation of the good 'aerobic organisms' that live within all of us and, like us they rely on oxygen to survive, drown them in liquid and they will die... keep them alive and happy and they will munch everything up, which includes all those bad bugs that create the nasty smells.

It's that simple and that clever!!

Thank you for using it properly, you have made the good bugs very happy.







Instructions for using the Villa

To use the toilet, treat as you would an ordinary WC. Gentlemen must sit on this toilet please, to avoid any liquid going into the back compartment.

Sit back on the seat and the flap will open allowing solids to pass one way, the urine will be automatically diverted down through the front of the unit.



Toilet paper is placed into the back section, by either pressing the seat to open the flap or by placing behind you whilst sitting.

When starting a new container, cover the bottom of it with the starter medium provided. Should anyone have a loose stool, or inadvertently urinate into the back container, sprinkle more flax or shell onto contents.

The contents must be neither too wet nor too dry, as this will render the aerobic microorganisms totally ineffective. They can drown from too much liquid and dry out from having far too much dry material added.





To clean the toilet

Under no circumstances allow the use of chemicals i.e. Mr Muscle, Cillit bang, Bleach etc. to be used when the cleaning the toilet, they will destroy the good aerobic bacteria which are the essential part of the composting process. Eco friendly cleaners are very safe, Please do not pour water down the urinal part to 'flush it' water contains hydrogen and urine contains nitrogen when the two are mixed the result will be ammonia. If you have any concerns, a sugar cube will negate any odour. If you have a holding tank for the urine, 250g of granulated sugar put directly into the tank will also reduce any odour problem. Once every 3 weeks or so make up a solution of half a litre of hot water and half a litre of white vinegar and a couple of drops of tea tree oil (optional). Pour this solution down the urine pipe to clear any proteins that may have attached to the pipe, also any crystals that may have formed. Under normal circumstances do not pour just water down the pipe to flush. Should you find that the pipe is blocking the above process should be carried out. The bridging piece, which separates the two chambers is easily removed for washing and the seat, underneath and flap can be cleaned with eco friendly cleaner or the cleaner can be sprayed onto toilet or kitchen roll and after wiping around can be placed into the back to degrade down with the rest of the solid matter.







The Residue!!

When you are ready to change your first container, (you will know when, a) either by looking into the container or, b) having the loo paper tickle your undercarriage!)

Open the bonnet of the toilet and put a lid on the container, remove from the toilet and either put somewhere to sit for 26 weeks, after which it can be dug into the ground, or should you not require it/ or have any use for it, it can be legally placed into a council recycling green/brown bin. If you have a predilection to use the compost, on removing from the toilet, it can, if you wish be put into your compost heap. Make a well in the compost, place the contents of the container within and replace the compost over the top.

After the 26 weeks use the compost to grow the most wonderful plants and vegetables.
